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Since people in the mining areas are prone various types of accidents, transporting critical patients to First Referral Units (FRUs) is mandatory where Ambulances play a significant role. They provide prompt medical care to patients by providing first aid and stabilizing the patient's conditions till they reach the FRUs.



Coverage:
This Project is being implemented in 4 mining affected districts i.e. Jajpur, Mayurbhanj, Sundargarh, Keonjhar.

A total of 12 Basic Life Support (BLS) and 03 Advanced Life Support (ALS) Ambulances have been procured by the H&FW department and deployed at different Health facilities in the 04 tribal mining districts- Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj, Sundargarh and Jajpur.

81 cases benefited from Advanced Life Support (ALS) between October 2021 and December 2023, while 98 cases benefited from Basic Life Support (BLS) between November 2021 and November 2023.
